## Wisconsin 4-H Youth Development Code of Conduct

4-H Participants will:

- Adhere to program rules, curfews, dress codes, policies, and rules of the facility being used.
- Conduct themselves in a courteous, respectful manner, use appropriate language, exhibit good sportsmanship, and provide positive role models.
- Comply with local, state, and federal laws.
- Abstain from use of alcohol, illicit drugs, and tobacco during 4-H events and activities.
- Fully participate in scheduled activities.
- Respect other's property and privacy rights.
- Abstain from child abuse (physical, sexual, emotional, and neglect), harassment and bullying.
- Accept personal responsibility for behavior including any financial damage.
- Adhere to safety rules.

Consequences for violating any part of this Code of Conduct may include, but are not limited to:

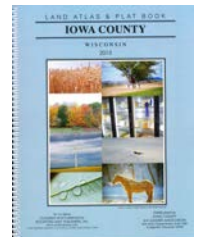
- Removal from participation in the event in which the Code of Conduct has been violated (at the individual's expense).
- Suspension of membership.
- Sanctions on participation in future 4-H events.
- Forfeiture or repayment of financial support for the event.
- Removal from leadership positions held.
- Loss of status as a "member in good standing".

It is the responsibility of all program participants to reinforce the code of conduct and intervene when necessary to enforce the rules.

Steer ID for the Iowa County Fair is scheduled for **Saturday, January 25** at the Mark Carey Farm Barn (674 County Road O) west of Mineral Point from 9:00 am to 11 am. Steers to be shown at County Fair will need to be identified at this time. If an exhibitor wants his/her animal in the County fair Rate of Gain contest, it must be weighed on January 25<sup>th</sup> at the County Fair Identification. No recent castrations, steers must be healed over – NO BULLS!! Contact Jarred Searls at 608-393-3735 with questions. **Steers identified for State Fair MUST submit a copy of the State Fair ID form to the Extension Office by March 1 and this will identify the steer for the Iowa County Fair.**

## **MAQA(Meat Animal Quality Assurance)**

The Meat Animal Quality Assurance program (MAQA) is a Wisconsin-developed program that teaches quality assurance practices to Swine, Beef, and Sheep project members. **Anyone who plans on showing market hogs at Iowa County or Wisconsin State Fair MUST be MAQA certified.** The Extension Office will offer MAQA certification from **1- 3 pm on February 8 and 1 – 3 pm and 7- 9 pm on June 18 and July 10**. All swine exhibitors who need to be certified or re-certified need to attend one of these MAQA programs in order to exhibit at the fair. To register for an MAQA session, CONTACT THE EXTENSION OFFICE AT 930-9850 OR [muffy.swingen@iowacounty.org](mailto:muffy.swingen@iowacounty.org). **Youth MUST register in advance to attend a MAQA Session.**

**Swine project members in grades 3-13 will need to be certified in MAQA every year. However, youth who are in the intermediate age group (age 12-14, grades 6-8) or the advanced age group (ages 15-18, grades 9-13) have the option to “test out” at 6 pm on July 10. Youth who plan to “test out” must pre-register with the Extension Office. The “Test Out” does NOT qualify as an educational program. Contact Lisa Schlimgen for more information about the “test out” option.**
