




Make your contribution by volunteering! JOIN 4-H - Even as an adult!

4-H FOUNDATION SCHOLARSHIPS

Wisconsin 4-H Foundation scholarships are awarded to students based on demonstrated personal growth, development and leadership, academic performance, financial need and future educational goals with specific criteria for designated awards. To be considered for financial support, applications must be received by the Wisconsin 4-H Foundation by March 31, 2014.

To be eligible for these scholarships, students must: have been a 4-H member for at least one year; have a grade point average of at least 2.5 on a 4.0 scale; be enrolled or planning to enroll in a university, college or technical school during the 2014-2015 academic school year; and meet any other eligibility requirements specific to the individual scholarship.

Celebrating Wisconsin's 4-H Centennial

Wisconsin 4-H Youth Development is celebrating 100 years of positive youth development programming in 2014. Since 1914, Wisconsin 4-H has helped youth grow the leadership, critical thinking and communications skills necessary to be successful in a constantly changing world.

4-H ORAL HISTORY PROJECT: One project you might do is to conduct oral history interviews with 4-H alumni. Were your parents or grandparents in 4-H? Do you know any former 4-H Volunteers? Talk to them about how 4-H used to be and present a speech to your 4-H club or write a story and enter it at the Fair.



Here are some questions you might ask of these 4-H alumni:

- How did you get involved in 4-H?
- Tell us about your family history with 4-H, were your relatives or family members involved?
- Describe your experience as a 4-H volunteer.
- Describe the 4-H clubs and programs that you've been a part of, and which counties they were in.
- Tell me about one 4-H project you really enjoyed. Why did you choose that project?
- Can you share a good/funny/interesting/meaningful story of someone you met through 4-H.
- Describe the most memorable agent/leader/volunteer in your 4-H experience.
- Share one difference that you've noticed between 4-H when you were involved and 4-H now.
- Tell us your most positive memory of 4-H.
- What did you learn from 4-H that you've continued to use as an adult?
- Do you have any words of advice or encouragement for today's 4-Hers?

SWINE PROJECT CHANGES TO IDENTIFICATION AND THE FAIR AUCTION

On February 11, 2014, Dr. Paul McGraw, state veterinarian at the Wisconsin Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection (DATCP) made an announcement regarding Porcine Epidemic Diarrhea virus (PEDv). Due to this announcement lowa County is taking a proactive approach to the 2014 fair show season.

New for 2014:

- Adults will not be driving from farm-to-farm to identify lowa County Fair swine.
- From May 1-25, youth must self-identify their swine for the Iowa County Fair.
- Youth must submit identification photos and the appropriate paperwork for their swine to the Extension office by May 26, 2014 in order to exhibit at the Iowa County Fair.
- The lowa County Fair will be a terminal show for <u>all</u> swine. All swine that are exhibited will go to market; no swine can be taken home from the fair.

Youth enrolled in the swine project will receive a packet of information from the Extension Office which will include the Iowa County Fair swine self-identification information. Please contact your veterinarian with specific questions regarding PEDv.

ATTENTION GOAT EXHIBITORS

There will be 2 educational goat classes this year – it is MANDATORY to attend 1 class to exhibit at the county fair. The first class will be held at Project Learning Day II on July 19 at the fairgrounds. The second will be in August at the Heberlein Farm. IOWA COUNTY FAIR LAMB IDENTIFCATION will be held on Saturday, April 26. Everyone who plans to exhibit sheep at the lowa County Fair MUST identify their lambs or bring their State Fair identification papers to the Fairgrounds on April 26 from 9 to noon. State Fair ID papers will NOT be accepted after April 26. THIS IS THE ONLY DATE TO IDENTIFY YOUR LAMBS FOR THE FAIR.

MARKET ANIMAL RECORD FORM: All youth selling steers, lambs, barrows or meat goats at the 2014 lowa County Fair must complete a "Market Animal Record" form and turn it in the species superintendent at weigh in at the 2014 fair to sell in the auction this year! Youth will NOT be allowed to sell if they do not turn in a completed form and complete an educational program.

DAIRY

There will be a **MANDATORY** meeting for all **State Fair Dairy** exhibitors at 7:30 pm on Monday, March 31 who plan to exhibit at the 2014 State Fair. If the member exhibiting at the state fair can't attend, a parent or other family member must be there.

DAIRY PROMOTION BOARD SCHOLARSHIPS: The Wisconsin State Fair Dairy Promotion Board will award three \$1,000 scholarships, for use during the second semester of the 2014-15 school year, to third or fourth-year college students pursuing dairy-related or food science degrees at one of Wisconsin's four-year universities. Two additional \$1,000 scholarships will be made available to high school seniors planning to pursue a dairy-related or food science degree at one of Wisconsin's four-year universities or students studying in a two-year, technical school program related to dairy or food science. MAQA (Meat Animal Quality Assurance)

The Meat Animal Quality Assurance program (MAQA) is a Wisconsin-developed program that teaches quality assurance practices to Swine, Beef, and Sheep project members. Anyone who plans on showing market hogs at lowa County or Wisconsin State Fair MUST be MAQA certified. The Extension Office will offer MAQA certification sessions on June 18 from 1-3 pm, and July 10 from 1-3 pm & 7-9 pm. All swine exhibitors who need to be certified or re-certified need to attend one of these MAQA programs in order to exhibit at the fair. Swine project members in grades 3-13 need to be MAQA certified every year. However, youth who are in the intermediate age group (age 12-14, grades 6-8) or the advanced age groups (ages 15-18, grades 9-13) have the option to "test out". Test will take place one hour prior to each learning session. Youth who plan to "test out" <u>must pre-register</u> with the Extension Office. The "test out" option does NOT qualify as an educational program. Contact Lisa Schlimgen for more information about the "test out" option.

CLOVERBUD CORNER



SLIDING THERMOMETER

Make a thermometer out of white drawing paper with a slit at the bottom in which you can place a slip of colored paper (red). Mark the thermometer in increments of five degrees, using temperatures above and below 0 degrees. Think about what a thermometer measures. What is your favorite temperature? What temperature is hot? At what temperature does water freeze? Keep track of temperatures each day with your thermometer.

LET'S MAKE EVERY DAY, EARTH DAY!

Earth Day is April 22. Earth day is intended for all of us to recognize how we influence our limited resources from our planet. There are often activities, campaigns and events scheduled on this day to promote awareness of Earth issues. You may choose to participate in a local event or start your own! Some ideas that you could put in motion are:



- Pick up trash on the playground
- Help Mom and Dad with recycling garbage at home
- Plant a tree

Here are some other things you can do to love and protect the environment every day!

- **1. Awaken Your Senses** to nature all around you, even in the city. Just step outside, and nature is right there. Is it windy? What do the clouds look like? Is it sunny? What is the first bird that you hear?
- 2. Use Less Water: turning off the tap while you brush your teeth will save four gallons a minute. In the shower, turning off the water while you shampoo and condition your hair can save more than 50 gallons a week.
- **3. Attack The Energy Monster**: Always turn off the lights when you leave a room, and replace incandescent bulbs with compact fluorescent bulbs (CFLs). They are more expensive but will last much longer
- **4. Commute Without Polluting**: Take mass transit or at least carpool if you can. Best of all, ride a bike! There are huge physical and fiscal benefits to biking.
- **5. Know The Top 10 items to recycle:** aluminum, PET plastic bottles, newspaper, corrugated cardboard, steel cans, HDPE plastic bottles, glass containers, magazines, mixed paper and computers.
- **6. Just Say No** to paper and plastic bags. Carry your stuff home from the store in a reusable bag.
- **7. Put A Cap** on bottled water: roughly 50 billion plastic water bottles end up in U.S. landfills each year, which is 140 million every day. Use refillable water bottles.
- **8.** Buy Locally Produced Food. When you do, you are helping reduce the pollutions and depletion of resources associated with the transportation and packaging of food.
- **9. Weigh Your Waste**. Weigh on a bathroom scale every bag of garbage you create before you take it out. Do this for a week, and multiply by 52 to get a rough estimate of how much waste you produce in a year. Then figure out how you can cut your waste production!
- **10. Avoid The "Print" Button**. Think twice before printing from the computer. You can read most documents and magazines online, and you can pay many bills via the web these days. When you do print, use both sides of your paper as much as possible.
