The following policy statement was adopted by the Iowa County 4-H Leaders Association on Monday, January 26. This WILL be in effect for 2015. Contact the Extension Office or your 4-HClub leader with questions.

Code of Conduct Statement - "Member in Good Standing"

To participate in the Iowa County Fair, receive a 4-H Graduation Scholarship, participate in a 4-H trip or represent Iowa County or Wisconsin on a 4-H Judging Team or at a 4-H speaking contest, Iowa County members must be "4-H Members in Good Standing". To be a 4-H member in good standing, a member must attend at least four (4) 4-H Club Events (club meetings, fund raisers or community service activities) by August 1st of each year."

6th Annual 4-H Food Fight

Saturday, April 18, 2015 at the Iowa County Food Pantry

County Line 4-H Club is challenging all County 4-H Clubs to a Food Fight to raise food and supplies for the Iowa County Food Pantry. All clubs should bring their food and supplies to the Food Pantry (entrance behind building) on Saturday, April 18, between 8:30 and 11 am. We will be adding up the weights of items and money and will determine the Top Large Club and Top Small Club (over 25 members is large).

County Line 4-H Club will be participating, but not eligible for the reward for the winning clubs.

Let's try to beat our last year total!

The food pantry is currently very low on paper products and laundry detergent. The Dollar Tree and Dollar General have very good prices on these items.

Rules:

- 1. All food will be physically weighed by Food Pantry staff on their scale. (If scale is not functioning, then it will be checked in by weight listed on package.)
- 2. No home canning is allowed. They will be negatively assessed at 16 oz each.
- 3. No expired items are allowed. They will be negatively assessed at 16 oz each.
- 4. No Ramen Noodles allowed. They will be negatively assessed at 16 oz each.
- 5. All laundry soap, personal products (shampoo, conditioner, etc.) will be positively assessed at twice the listed weight.
- 6. Paper products will be listed at the below weights:

Toilet paper-every 4 rolls will be equal to 5 pounds

Kleenex-every 1 box equals 5 pounds

Paper towels-every 1 roll equals 5 pounds

- 7. Every \$1.00 donated equals 5 pounds
- 8. All donations made must be made before April 18 to count in the Food Fight. Please call to make arrangements.

LIVESTOCK

MARKET ANIMAL RECORD FORM: All youth selling steers, lambs, barrows or meat goats at the 2015 lowa County Fair must complete a "Market Animal Record" form and turn it in the species superintendent at weigh in at the 2015 fair to sell in the auction this year! Youth will NOT be allowed to sell if they do not turn in a completed form and complete an educational program.

LIVESTOCK JUDGING PRACTICES will be held Sunday Nights on May 31st and in June (June 7, June 14, June 21) at 6:00 pm. Practice on May 31 will be held at Jeff Thomas' farm in Cobb, other locations to be determined. If you have any questions, call Jeff Thomas at 574-7265.

SWINE IDENTIFICATION

Swine ID for 2015:

- From May 1-25, youth must self-identify their swine for the Iowa County Fair.
- Youth must submit identification photos and the appropriate paperwork for their swine to the Extension office by May 26, 2015 in order to exhibit at the Iowa County Fair.
- The lowa County Fair will be a terminal show for <u>all</u> swine. All swine that are exhibited will go to market; no swine can be taken home from the fair.

Youth enrolled in the swine project will receive a packet of information from the Extension Office which will include the Iowa County Fair swine self-identification information. Please contact your veterinarian with specific questions regarding PEDv.

Note – due to the PEDv virus, please wear clean clothes, and shoes that have NOT been worn around swine.

ATTENTION GOAT EXHIBITORS

There will be 2 educational goat classes offered again next year, one is MANDATORY!!!!! Youth must attend one of the two educational goat classes in order to show at the fair. For more information or questions about the goat project, call Clare Heberlein at 574-9829 or Cathy Wiesbrook at 574-1344.

IOWA COUNTY FAIR LAMB IDENTIFCATION will be held on Saturday, April 25.

Everyone who plans to exhibit sheep at the Iowa County Fair MUST identify their lambs or bring their State Fair identification papers to the Fairgrounds on April 25. State Fair ID papers will NOT be accepted after April 25. All Lambs MUST have scrapie tags. Whethers and Ewes will be ID'd, no rams allowed. Youth who purchased lambs out of state must have a COOL form signed by the seller. All youth must have their premise ID with them at the Lamb Weigh-In.

New for 2015! Youth interested in showing market beef, sheep or swine at the 2015 Wisconsin State Fair will need to get their animal projects DNA/RFID identified through the Wisconsin Livestock Identification Consortium (WLIC) by the respective Wisconsin State Fair eligibility deadlines. Sheep & Swine: Monday - May 11, 2015

MAQA(Meat Animal Quality Assurance)

The Meat Animal Quality Assurance program (MAQA) is a Wisconsin-developed program that teaches quality assurance practices to Swine, Beef, and Sheep project members. Anyone who plans on showing market hogs at lowa County or Wisconsin State Fair MUST be MAQA certified. The Extension Office will offer MAQA certification from 1 – 3 pm and 7- 9 pm on June 17 and from 1 – 3 pm July 7. All swine exhibitors who need to be certified or re-certified need to attend one of these MAQA programs in order to exhibit at the fair. To register for an MAQA session, CONTACT THE EXTENSION OFFICE AT 930-9850 OR muffy.swingen@iowacounty.org. Youth MUST register in advance to attend a MAQA Session.

Swine project members in grades 3-13 will need to be certified in MAQA every year. However, youth who are in age 12-14, grades 6-8 or (ages 15-18, grades 9-13 have the option to "test out" at 6 pm on June 17. Youth who plan to "test out" must pre-register with the Extension Office. The "Test Out" does NOT qualify as an educational program. Contact Deb Ivey about the "test out" option.

<u>AUCTION EDUCATION PROGRAMS</u>




