

New this year sheep ID will be self-identified.(similar to swine id) Youth must submit an identification head photo including the scrapie tag and the appropriate paperwork for their sheep to the Extension Office by May 18th.

Youth enrolled in the sheep project will receive a packet of information from the Extension Office which will include the Iowa County Fair sheep self-identification information.

Shooting Sports practices

Shooting sports practices will start on April 29th for new members. All members will start on May 6th. Other practice dates include: May 6, 13, 20; July 22 and 29; August 5, and 12. The competitive shoot will be on August 19th. A more detailed letter will be sent to all those enrolled in April.



Swine ID

Swine ID will be From May 1-25, youth must self-identify their swine for the Iowa County Fair.

Youth must submit identification photos and the appropriate paperwork for their swine to the Extension office by May 26, 2018 in order to exhibit at the Iowa County Fair.

Youth enrolled in the swine project will receive a packet of information from the Extension Office which will include the Iowa County Fair swine self-identification information.

New this year—-pigs will have to be tested for SECD and PRRS within 90 days of the fair. The cost of the test will be dependent upon what test was done prior by the producer but typically range between \$10-75. The superintendents felt is was important to keep the fair non-terminal to allow for more options for exhibitors.

YQCA (Youth for the Quality Care of Animals)

Starting in the fall of 2017, Wisconsin will replace the MAQA program with the YQCA national program. YQCA was created for youth in the beef, dairy, goat, poultry, rabbit, sheep, and swine projects. Anyone who plans on showing market hogs at lowa County or Wisconsin State Fair MUST be YQCA certified. ALL State Fair exhibitors (Dairy, Beef, Sheep, Swine, Goat, Rabbit, Poultry) must also be certified in YQCA in 2018.

lowa County will only offer the face to face classes for youth in grades 3-4. Everyone else must take the class online. In the online version, the youth exhibitor will complete 3 interactive online modules and corresponding quizzes. The 3 modules includes information about animal welfare, food safety, and character education. The modules will provide new information every year. The modules take roughly 60 minutes to complete each year. There are also fees associated with YQCA. The online version is \$12 per youth and face to face is \$3. Youth must register and pay for YQCA at http://yqca.org and follow the step by step instructions.

The Extension Office will offer an YQCA certification sessions on June 20th from 6-7pm at the HHS Building or July 21st at Project Learning Day II for 3rd & 4th graders. **County Line** 4-H monthly meeting was held on Jan. 8th at Hope Lutheran Church. 
Under old business the club discussed Project Learning Days. We will host cupcake decorating, for two sessions. Project Learning Days will be at the HHS building.
