YQCA (Youth for the Quality Care of Animals)



Iowa County Fair board is requiring any youth who show animals in the following departments: dairy, beef, swine, sheep, goats, rabbits, and poultry to take YQCA in order to exhibit at the 2021 Iowa County Fair.

> No other educational requirement will be needed to participate in the Iowa County Fair Auction.

Youth will need their YOCA certification number to complete fair entries by the deadline of August 1.

lowa County will offer in-person classes this summer if approved and a space is available with PowerPoint capabilities. Watch the next newsletter for dates or contact Sarah Weier if you would like her to visit your area to present YQCA.

Youth can also take YQCA online. In the online version, the youth exhibitor will complete 3 interactive online modules and corresponding guizzes. The 3 modules includes information about animal welfare, food safety, and character education. The modules will provide new information every year. The modules take roughly 60 minutes to complete each year.

There are fees associated with YQCA. The online version is \$12 per youth and in-person is \$3. Youth must register and pay for YQCA at http://yqca.org and follow the step by step instructions.

*****4-H Members should log-in with their 4-H online account!***** This allows Extension staff to view certification number and expiration date.

YQCA Test Out Option

An online YQCA test out option for multi-year certification is available. You can only take these tests when you are 12, 15 and 19 (on December 31 of the previous calendar year). The test has 50 questions and you to need answer 80% correctly to pass. Youth can only take the test ONCE at the beginning of the age group – if you don't pass you must take the online course or attend an in-person meeting every year for the next three or four years. The credit card is billed when the youth passes the test. To find the test out option, scroll to the bottom of the course list when you are logged into YQCA.

12 – 13 -14: You can only take the test as a 12 year old.	Cost is \$36.00.
15-16-17-18: You can only take the test as 15 year old.	Cost is \$48.00
19-20-21: You can only take the test has a 19 year old.	Cost is \$36.00.

There will be no Space Camp, American Spirit or Western Spirit opportunities in 2021. No announcement has been made regarding National 4-H Congress in November at Atlanta, Georgia.

2nd Annual Wisconsin 4-H Service Learning Project

Plarn Mats Project

What is plarn? It's "plastic yarn." Youth cut plastic shopping bags into loops. They knot those loops together to make plastic yarn. One youth or volunteer crochets the plarn into a mat. Reusing plastic bags helps the environment. Donated mats support individuals who are experiencing unsheltered homelessness.

Who can be part of the project? Everyone. From Kindergarten to adulthood, anyone can help. Youth can help collect and sort bags, cut plastic loops, knot plarn together. They can even crochet the plarn into a mat. Youth leaders play an important role in identifying where to donate plarn or mats, leading discussions, and organizing the project.

What will the youth learn? Youth learn about homelessness through the project, going beyond stereotypes we see on television. The Explore More section encourages youth to do research and get involved. Then, they can share what they learn with others. Information and resources are included to support youth participants who know someone or are experiencing homelessness themselves.

Premise ID – Wisconsin Department of Agriculture requires premises registration for all locations where livestock are kept or congregated. This includes farms, hobby farms, and county fairs. Iowa County Fair must provide premise ID's to WDATCP officials for all livestock exhibited. Livestock includes cattle, swine, goats, sheep, poultry, game birds, horses and more.

Premises ID numbers can be obtained by visiting <u>https://datcp.wi.gov/</u> and searching for premise ID.

Area Animal Science Days (AASD) – Wisconsin 4-H is in the baby steps of planning regional Area Animal Science Days. Format, locations and dates have not been announced.

Swine, Goat, Sheep ID – The identification rules and processes are determined by the Iowa County Fair. Animal identification materials will be emailed to project members as soon as they are sent to Extension. Watch your email carefully in the next month for details.

Poultry – Wisconsin Department of Agriculture has indicated they will be requiring testing of poultry for 2021 fairs and shows. Information will be provide to project members when the fair has more information.

Dairy Judging – We will be organizing dairy judging practices soon, and if members are interested they should reach out to Laura or Ashley, <u>lauradaniels@uwalumni.com</u> or <u>aayager@uwalumni.com</u>. Iowa County Dairy Judging has a private Facebook page. Ask Ashley to invite you to join for the most up-to-date information.
