YQCA Information



A current Youth for the Quality Care of Animals (YQCA) certification is **REQUIRED** for all youth exhibitors who are housing animals overnight at our county fairgrounds. Youth must enter the YQCA certificate number when submitting entries in Fair Entry Online. Families can capture this number by logging into YQCA at **https://yqca.learngrow.io/Account/Login**. Iowa County Extension can see youth who used their 4HOnline account when registering for a YQCA class. Contact Tom Harman at 930-9850 or at <u>Tom.Harman@iowacounty.org</u> by **Wednesday, July 28**th if you need assistance locating your number.

This is the only education accepted for exhibitors, including youth participating in the auction. YQCA can be obtained two ways: online test for \$12.00 at https://yqca.leamgrow.io/Account/Login or attend an in-person meeting for \$3.00. In-person training is only available for ages 8-18 as of January 1, 2021. Youth who were 19 as of January 1 must complete the online test.

Pre-Register and pay \$3.00 fee with credit card at https://yqca.leamgrow.io/Account/Login - the Extension Office cannot accept fees or register youth for YQCA.

4-H Project News

Project Literature - Iowa County Extension has a variety of 4-H project literature free to members. The materials are geared to youth allowing them to explore and learn at different age levels. Email <u>sarah.weier@wisc.edu</u> to see if we have material in a specific project area.

Robotics Kits - Iowa County 4-H has four LEGO Mindstoms Robotic kits. You build and program a robot using free software downloaded from LEGO. You don't need to be in the robotics project to borrow a kit. 4-H families can borrow these kits for one month by contacting Sarah Weier at <u>sarah.weier@wisc.edu</u>.

Premise ID - Wisconsin Department of Agriculture requires premises registration for all locations where livestock are kept or congregated. This includes farms, hobby farms, and county fairs. Iowa County Fair must provide premise ID's to WDATCP officials for all livestock exhibited. Livestock includes cattle, swine, goats, sheep, poultry, game birds, horses, and more.

Premises ID numbers can be obtained by visiting <u>https://datcp.wi.gov/</u> and searching for premise ID.

Horse - Open rides @ Iowa County Fairgrounds (6PM - 8PM): July 15, 22, and 29.

Model Horse - A workshop and demonstration will be held the evening of August 9th for youth interested in this project. Watch for an announcement through 4HOnline email and Facebook posts.

Archery - Archery sessions are scheduled for July 10 (12-4pm), July 17 (8am-noon), August 14 (12-4pm), and August 21 (8am-noon). There will be a limit of 20 per session, so please contact Amanda at (608) 574-6855 to reserve a spot for each session. Sessions are only open to those who are registered for the

Archery project with the state. We will only be using 4-H bows for these sessions, so please leave personal bows at home. Please bring completed permission slip (mailed previously) to the session; participants will not be able to participate in the shooting portion without a completed permission slip.

4-H Club Charters

4-H charters are now a two-step process. The first part, financials, are due **September 1**st. Be sure to add the names of individuals who have account authorizations on page 3. The Financial Review section now requires 2 adults unrelated to the person who completed the report and who are not directly involved with the club finances (not a signer on the accounts). Employees working in the Iowa County Extension office may no longer be financial reviewers. Club leaders will get an email with fillable reports to complete.



The second part, Club Contacts, Calendar, and Goals, is due **November1st.** This will be completed via an electronic survey. At the September 20th Leaders Association meeting, we will review the second part of the charter. It has been simplified and looks very different.

Ambassador Applications



All youth who have completed 8th grade to 12th grade are eligible to apply for an official role as lowa County 4-H Ambassadors. Ambassadors get a jump start on career development by interviewing, speaking in public, planning events, and promoting 4-H. New this year, applications and recommendations may be returned electronically (please no pictures of completed applications). Forms were sent out via 4HOnline or contact Tom Harman at <u>Tom.Harman@iowacounty.org</u> for a fillable application. The deadline to apply is **July 15th**.

Updated Wisconsin 4-H Meeting Guidelines



Effective June 2, all fully-vaccinated Wisconsin 4-H staff, volunteers, and participants are no longer required to wear masks during programs. We ask that individuals who are not fully vaccinated, including youth under 12, continue to wear masks. Staff and volunteers will not enforce mask wearing or ask for proof of vaccination for those not wearing masks. Masks may still be worn if preferred, and individual masking choices should not be interpreted as an indicator of vaccination status.

- Outdoors: Physical distancing is no longer required outdoors. Individuals who are not vaccinated are encouraged to wear a face covering.
- Indoors: There are no group size limits on indoor gatherings. Individuals who are not vaccinated are encouraged to wear a face covering.
- Transportation: Any individual who is not vaccinated should wear a face covering when driving or riding with others.

This updated policy applies to all Wisconsin 4-H programs, including overnight programs, 4-H programs at county fairs, and food stands.

As a reminder, Wisconsin 4-H staff, volunteers, and participants should continue to follow local public health guidance.

Basket Making - July 16 10-11:30 am Cost \$6

People have been making baskets for thousands of years to carry and store things in. Here is your chance to make your own basket. We will learn some basic weaving techniques, and you will have choices for reed colors and beads to make your basket uniquely your own. Grades 3-6.





Fun with Photography - July 16 and 23 12-2:00 pm Cost \$12.50

What attracts us to some images while we walk right past others? It's often the composition how the elements in the image are arranged - that makes all the difference! Learn and practice compositional techniques that will engage your viewers and take your photography to the next level in this hands-on workshop, Grades 5-8.

Handmade Paper Book - July 27 and 30, 1-2:30pm Cost \$12.50

Participants will make paper pulp using recycled paper. They will personalize their paper pulp by adding glitter, chopped foil, foil stars, cut ribbon, cut lace, dried herbs, or spices like cinnamon. They will learn how to use a mold and deckle to pull sheets of paper. They will give their paper texture using fabric, lace, or metal or plastic screens when pressing their sheets. During the second session, they will assemble their book from the sheets of paper that they made. They might want to sew on beads, or glue on buttons, or draw lines with ink to finish an image. Grades 3-12.
