Iowa County Fair board is requiring any youth who show animals in the following departments: dairy, beef, swine, sheep, goats, rabbits, and poultry to take YQCA to exhibit at the 2022 lowa County Fair.

No other educational requirement will be accepted for entry or auction.

Youth will need a current YQCA certification number to complete fair entries by the deadline of August 1st.

Two in-person trainings will be held in the Community Room of the Health & Human Services Building, 303 West Chapel Street, Dodgeville. Training will last one hour.

- Monday, June 27th at 5pm
- Sunday, July 17th at 6pm

The YQCA website is: <u>https://yqcaprogram.org/</u>. Youth need to pre-register at this website for trainings. Families will need to create an account on the new website for YQCA. Families MUST pay for the training at time of registering. Extension cannot accept payments for YQCA.

In-person trainings cost \$3.00 per youth. Web-based courses cost \$12.00 per youth. Either in-person or web-based trainings will meet the YQCA requirement for the Iowa County Fair.

Youth are asked to take a pre-survey and post-survey on-line. **The post-survey** <u>must</u> be completed **before accessing the certificate**. To take the surveys, log in to your account and select 'Enrolled Trainings' from the menu. To download/print the certificate, select 'Course Certificates' from the drop-down menu.

New this year: Extension will <u>not</u> be able view youth's YQCA certificate numbers. Families will need to download the YQCA certificate information and have it ready to type into fair entry.

YQCA is not associated with Extension or 4-H, therefore you will need to contact the Help Desk at YQCA for assistance navigating the website. Iowa County Extension has a help document that can be emailed to families which walks you through the registration and certificate process. Contact Sarah if you would like to receive the help document.

4-H Finances - Did you Know?

There should only be ONE person per family authorized (signer) on 4-H accounts. For example, if you have two signers, they should not be a parent and their child. 4-H Club charters require names of people authorized on 4-H financial accounts be provided. Wisconsin 4-H will be checking this information to be sure everyone is an approved 4-H member or adult volunteer.



Cake Decorating Project Kit



This summer, Iowa County 4-H is participating in the state-wide Cake Decoration Kits with support from the WI 4-H Foundation. This Project Kit is for youth of ALL AGES.

Each youth participant will receive a box containing a cake decorating kit, Discover 4-H Cake Decorating Curriculum, piping practice sheets, a buttercream frosting recipe, and a frosting troubleshooting guide. Families will need to purchase the ingredients to make a cake and buttercream frosting.

State Fair Entries



The 2022 Wisconsin State Fair Youth Exhibits programs are accepting nominations from Wisconsin youth ages 12-19 as of January 1st of the current Fair year. Wisconsin youth may nominate projects to be considered for Wisconsin State Fair judging and exhibition. Projects no longer need to be exhibited or selected at a Wisconsin County Fair.

- Entry Deadline: Monday, July 25, 2022 5 pm Central Standard Time. Entries must be completed online and all fees paid by the exhibitor by 5pm on Monday, July 25, 2022 to be considered for judging at the 2022 Wisconsin State Fair. Late entries will not be accepted. Entries are submitted online on www.wistatefair.com/competitions.
- Entry Fee: \$3.00 per project nominated. Visa, MasterCard, Discover, or American Express are accepted. There are no refunds of nomination fees.
- **Project Information:** The exhibitor entering the project must make the project. Any projects not made by the exhibitor will be disqualified. Projects entered, judged and/or displayed at Wisconsin State Fair in prior years are .not eligible for judging in 2022. Project must be under 5 feet high, 5 feet long, and 5 feet wide.
- **2022 Project Exhibit Divisions**: Arts & Crafts, Mechanical Sciences, Woodworking & Natural Resources, Photography: Black & White, Photography: Color, Textiles & Home Furnishing. Projects should be entered in the division where they best fit. Wisconsin State Fair management may move a project to another division if deemed more suitable for judging. All entries must be family friendly.
- **New for 2022!** Photography nominations will be accepted! Only 2 entries per division per youth will be accepted.
- Entries without complete information or fees will not be considered. See the "Junior General Rules and Regulations" section on www.wistatefair.com for additional rules. Wisconsin State Fair reserves the right to reject, accept, or conditionally accept any entry from any exhibitor.

Each exhibitor is responsible to ensure the safe transport of his/her project to Wisconsin State Fair for judging. To ensure project safety, please use adequate shipping material. **Each project must arrive with exhibitor's name and project division name on the back of the project** (information should not be visible for judging/display). No names/other identification should be on the front side of the project.

The Extension Office will be making a trip to deliver projects to the State Fair. Please have any projects to be delivered at the Extension Office by 4:00pm on Friday, July 22nd. Entrants will be responsible for delivering large, over-sized items themselves. Alternatively, projects may be shipped to the address below.

Ship projects to: Wisconsin State Fair/Youth Exhibits, Tommy G Thompson Youth Center, 640 S 84 St, West Allis WI 53214

Drop Off: Tommy G Thompson Youth Center. Enter the Wisconsin State Fair Park through Gate 5 (84 St/Schlinger Ave) and go to the Tommy G Thompson Youth Center located immediately inside Gate 5. Projects delivered in person will be accepted between 10am - 4pm on Tuesday, July 26, 2022.

Judging is scheduled for Thursday, July 28, 2022. Projects received after the Drop off deadline (Tuesday, July 26, 2022) will not be judged but may be displayed during the Wisconsin State Fair. Once judged, all projects will remain secured at Wisconsin State Fair until moved to its Fair display location. Exhibits will not be released until Wednesday, August 17, 2022 from 10am – 2pm at Tommy G Thompson Youth Center.

The float must be driven by a 4-H adult volunteer 21 years of age or older and an authorized driver by the University of Wisconsin - Madison. In order to become an authorized driver, volunteers must complete the UW-Madison Volunteer Driver Authorization Request form. The form says to allow 10 working days for processing, so be sure to submit your form well before the date of the parade!
