## It's 4-H Re-Enrollment Time!



Re-enrollment for current families (and enrollment for new families) in your 4-H club and projects will begin September 1<sup>st</sup> and is done through 4-H Online. The address is <a href="https://wi.4honline.com">https://wi.4honline.com</a>.

*User friendly* instructions and further details of how to enroll or re-enroll in 4-H can be found on the lowa County 4-H website here:

Youth in 3<sup>rd</sup> grade and up are full 4-H members and are able to choose from any of the projects listed in the project guide. Youth in grades K-2 should choose "Cloverbud".

Current members must re-enroll by December 1<sup>st</sup> to be eligible for financial support to attend educational travel, camp, and other 4-H events and activities. You can add projects and make changes until April 1<sup>st</sup>. On April 1<sup>st</sup>, member and project enrollment is shared with the lowa County Fair.

The enrollment fee must be paid to your 4-H leader when you re-enroll. The fee is \$10 per youth member, or \$30 for a family of three or more.

# 4-H Adult Re-Enrollment Tips



Adults who wish to be leaders will be asked to check box 'I'm confirming I want to enroll in 4-H as a Volunteer'. You will then select the volunteer type, and options will appear on the screen depending what you select. If you wish to be part of a club, select 'Club Volunteer' then the role: Activity Leader, Club Enrollment Coordinator, Club Leader, or Club Project Leader. When you select 'Club Project Leader', a list of projects will appear for you to select.

If an adult did not enter a birthdate in the old 4H Online, a date of 1/1/1920 has been entered for you. You may edit if you like after your enrollment is approved, but it is not required.

This system will not allow county staff to approve an adult volunteer if background screening and/or mandated reporter training is needed. In addition, new this year, all adult volunteers are required to participate in Title IX training.

# Project Spotlight: Youth Leadership & Ambassadors

The Youth Leadership and Ambassadors projects are both designed to give older 4-H members the opportunity to lead, learn, and teach. Youth Leadership is focused on the club level – think officers, project leaders who help young members, and committee chairs. Ambassadors are the county-wide group of youth who promote 4-H, do community service, recreation, and share the youth voice with adult leaders.





At the county fair, members in Youth Leadership and Ambassadors enter projects in Department 33. We are working on adding classes that reflect what youth do in 4-H as older members. Possible additions may be promoting through social media as well as traditional media (radio, newspaper) and a poster highlighting a 4-H experience such as American Spirit or national judging teams.

Funds are available to celebrate as a club or group your success! Approximately 30 grants will be awarded for the following amounts: \$100, \$200, or \$300. Grantees will be contacted after December 12, 2022, if they will be awarded the funds to celebrate their SMART goal success! Clubs and groups will be selected based on the level of youth involvement in the goal planning, actionable steps/objectives to reach the goal and the celebration plans. Your club or group can decide how to spend the SMART goal celebration funds.

We ask in return for the grant funds that you send us a photo and caption telling us how the funds were used to celebrate the club's SMART goal success. We may share your story on social media and in the WI 4-H newsletter.
