Wisconsin 4-H Foundation Scholarships



The Wisconsin 4-H Foundation will award more than \$20,000 in scholarships to outstanding Wisconsin 4-H members and alumni pursuing higher education in 2023. *To be considered for financial support, applications must be received by the Wisconsin 4-H Foundation via email by Wednesday, March 15, 2023, 5:00 pm.* Wisconsin 4-H Foundation scholarships are awarded to students based on demonstrated personal growth through 4-H, development and leadership in 4-H, academic performance and future educational goals.

To be eligible for Wisconsin 4-H Foundation scholarships students must have been a Wisconsin 4-H member for at least three years; should have a grade point average of at least 2.5 on a 4.0 scale, and be enrolled or planning to enroll at a university, college or technical school during the 2023-2024 academic school year. Scholarship winners from previous years are not eligible to receive a second 4-H Foundation scholarship.

There will be seven content tracks for the 2023 Summer Academy, with youth able to select their track and receive an engaging experience in their content area. The seven tracks for 2023 are Arts & Communication, Leadership & Civic Engagement, Agriculture & Animal Sciences, STEM, Hospitality/Culinary, Construction/ Trades, and Human Services.

Project Learning Day

Project Learning Day will be on **Saturday, February 4, 2023** at the HHS building in Dodgeville. The morning will consist of 50-minute session for Iowa County 4-H members to learn a new skill, explore a project area, or make a project ready to exhibit at the fair.



Animal Quiz Bowl - Join Blue Ribbon 4-H Club in learning about a quiz competition, asking questions on dairy, beef, swine, horses, sheep, and meat goats. Quiz bowl is a great opportunity to demonstrate your knowledge of animal science related subject matter. While it might be too late to join this year's competition teams, this session may encourage you want to sign up next year! (12 people per session maximum)

Nutritious Snack Mix Activity Session - Join Donna Peterson as she make a nutritious snack that you can then make at home. This is a hands-on activity creating a snack mix using a variety of snack foods. (10 people per session maximum)





Handmade Bookmarks - Create your own bookmark with Pleasant View 4-H. These are not your typical bookmarks...these will mark the pages in your favorite books for years to come! (10 people per session maximum; grades 2 and up. Youth in grades 2-4 will need to be accompanied by an adult or older sibling to assist)

Easy Science Experiments - Join Red Barn 4-H Club in having hands-on fun with some easy science experiments, including a make-and-take Oobleck, a magic leak-proof bag, dancing raisins, magic milk, and sugar water rainbows. (15 people per session maximum)





Picture Frame Art - Join the Five Point 4-H Club in creating a piece of art for your picture frame. Buttons, fabric, or whatever else we have on hand. (10 people per session maximum)

Valentines Day Necklaces - Join the Country Cardinals 4-H club to make your very own Valentine's Day necklace! Jewels, decals...we will have all the goodies to make your unique piece your own. This session will be best suited for Cloverbuds or interested younger members. (15 people per session maximum)





Cereal Box Collage - After reading <u>Cereal Box Collage</u> by Michael Albert, you will start making your own collage from an empty cereal box under the guidance of Sarah Weier. The artwork will need to be finished at home. (8 people per session maximum)

Introduction to Raspberry Pi - Tony Weier, Iowa County 4-H alumni, will show you how to get started with a Raspberry Pi. Raspberry Pi is a small, inexpensive, single-board computer to learn basic computer science skills. This session is best for youth in grade 5 and older. An adult is encouraged to accompany younger youth. (8 people per session maximum)

2023 Conservation Poster Contest - One Water

The annual NACD and NACD Auxiliary Poster Contest provides students from kindergarten through 12th grade the chance to have their art displayed as part of a national conservation outreach initiative. The contest starts at the district level; winners advance to the state level, and then to the national level, where they receive recognition at NACD's annual meeting.

The poster contest is open to public, private and home-schooled students. The top three posters in each category of the national contest will receive monetary prizes. First-place winners will receive \$200; second place winners will receive \$150 and third place winners will receive \$100.
