YQCA is a fair requirement to show animals at the lowa County Fair; it is **NOT** a 4-H sponsored training or requirement to participate in the 4-H program. YQCA offers an in-person class as well as an online version. The online version is a better educational opportunity...it is set up for the age level the youth sign up for when taking the training. The in-person training is set at the lowest level to reach all audiences in attendance.

When signing up for the YQCA training, you must login online to register and pay the \$3 per person fee. Youth also need to complete the pre-survey when signing up. Please go to the following link to register: YQCA — Youth for the Quality Care of Animals (yqcaprogram.org)

We are lucky here in Iowa County to have a Dairy Educator who offers two training for each county in our area. ## 4-H Food Fight is Back!



The Rockwell Mills 4-H Club is challenging all Iowa County 4-H clubs to a Food Fight to raise food, money, and supplies for the Iowa County Food Pantry. All clubs should bring their food and supplies to the Food Pantry at 138 S. Iowa Street in Dodgeville (entrance at back of building) on Thursday, May 16<sup>th</sup>, 2024, between 3:30 and 5:30pm. We will be adding up the weights of items and money and will determine the top large club (over 25 members) and top small club (25 or fewer members).

Rockwell Mills 4-H Club will be participating, but will not be eligible to compete.

Items most needed by the food pantry at this time are: Hamburger Helper, canned ravioli, cereal, and peanut butter.

#### Rules:

- 1. All food will be physically weighed by the Food Pantry staff on their scale.
- 2. No home canning is allowed. Home canned items will be negatively assessed at 16oz each.
- 3. No expired items are allowed. Expired items will be negatively assessed at 16oz each.
- 4. All donations must be made on or before May 16<sup>th</sup> to count in the Food Fight.
- 5. Every \$1 donated equals 1 pound.
