Wisconsin 4-H has released updated costs for many of the trips and experiences for the 2024-2025 year. In most cases, these costs ended up being higher than originally anticipated.

Although these trips and experiences are not cheap, they are wonderful opportunities for youth to reach out beyond their home club to learn things, see places, and meet people they otherwise wouldn't.

Scholarships are available that effectively pay for about one-third the cost of a trip (the difference between the "total cost" and "your cost" on the chart). The scholarship form is available on the Iowa County 4-H website under "Opportunities", then "Scholarships/Awards"

It's 4-H Re-Enrollment Time!



Re-enrollment for current families (and enrollment for new families) in your 4-H club and projects has begun and is done through 4-H Online. The address is <u>https://wi.4honline.com</u>.

User friendly instructions and further details of how to enroll or re-enroll in 4-H can be found on the Iowa County 4-H website here:

Youth in 3rd grade and up are full 4-H members and are able to choose from any of the projects listed in the project guide. Youth in grades K-2 should choose "Cloverbud".

Current members must re-enroll by December 1st to be eligible for financial support to attend educational travel, camp, and other 4-H events and activities. You can add projects and make changes until April 1st. On April 1st, member and project enrollment is shared with the lowa County Fair.

The fee is \$10 per youth member, or \$30 for a family of three or more.

4-H Adult Re-Enrollment Tips

Adults who wish to be leaders will be asked to check box 'I'm confirming I want to enroll in 4-H as a Volunteer'. You will then select the volunteer type, and options will appear on the screen depending what you select. If you wish to be part of a club, select 'Club Volunteer' then the role: Activity Leader, Club Enrollment Coordinator, Club Leader, or Club Project Leader. When you select 'Club Project Leader', a list of projects will appear for you to select.



This system will not allow county staff to approve an adult volunteer if background screening and/or mandated reporter training is needed. In addition, all adult volunteers are required each year to participate in Supporting You, Supporting Youth training (takes the place of Title IX). In addition, background checks will be conducted every two years.

Are you thinking of being a driver for a 4-H parade float in 2025? Why not complete the UW-Madison Volunteer Driver Authorization Form now along with your re-enrollment materials so you're ready to go for parade season? This form must be filled out each year and can take some time to process; if you complete it now, you won't have to worry about it later!
