### **Iowa County Attendance Policy**

### Iowa County 4-H Attendance Policy Effective Date: October 1, 2025

Being part of 4-H is an opportunity to explore new interests, develop life skills, and grow as a person. This attendance policy is designed to encourage youth to stay engaged and explore new sparks—areas of interest and passion they may not have discovered before. 4-H is about learning by doing, building connections, and growing into capable, caring members of the community.

All Iowa County 4-H members must participate in at least four (4) 4-H events or meetings by their club's June meeting date in order to be considered a member in good standing with 4-H. A member in good standing has the opportunity to show at the Iowa County Fair that year. Attendance may include:

- Monthly club meetings (in-person or virtual)
- County-wide 4-H events or workshops
- 4-H community service activities
- 4-H fundraisers or educational opportunities
- Club or county-level leadership activities
- Other determined at the club leader's discretion

#### **New Members**

If a new member joins 4-H during the program year, they must meet the four-event requirement or follow an adjusted attendance plan as determined by their club leader.

### **Returning Members**

Returning members' attendance counts start in September. Members who transfer from one club to another during the year will not have their attendance requirement reset to the month of transfer.

#### **Digital Participation**

Members may participate in club meetings digitally (e.g., Skype, FaceTime, Google Meet, phone, etc.) if the club allows it. Arrangements for digital participation must be made with the club leader. Clubs are encouraged to develop a digital participation plan for the year.

#### **Parent Attendance**

Parents may not attend meetings or events on behalf of their child to fulfill the member's attendance requirement.

#### **Make-Up Opportunities**

If a member cannot participate in four 4-H events or meetings, they may coordinate with their club leader to attend another approved educational opportunity. All make-up activities must be completed by the club's June meeting date.

#### **Special Circumstances**

Members with special circumstances may submit a written request for review by the County 4-H Educator and the Attendance Committee. Following review, all decisions made by the 4-H Educator and Attendance Committee are final.

#### **Attendance Committee**

The Attendance Committee will consist of:

- The County 4-H Educator
- 4-H Adult Leaders Board
- Two (2) youth representatives from the 4-H Junior Leaders

## **4-H Gingerbread Contest**

### Eligibility:

- ·Open to all youth currently enrolled in 4-H in lowa County.
- ·Participants may enter individually or as a team

### Judging:

- ·Judging will take place Monday, December 15th through Thursday, December 18th.
  - ·Entries will be evaluated based on:
    - o Creativity & Originality
    - o Use of Edible Materials
  - o Overall Presentation & Neatness
    - o Seasonal Theme
- ·Judges will evaluate both in-person entries and photographs uploaded online.
- ·The display will be open to the community at the Extension Office during regular office hours, community members are encouraged to vote for their favorite gingerbread house or scene.
  - ·Awards will be given for 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, and 3<sup>rd</sup> places.

#### Submission:

- ·Participants must bring their fully constructed and decorated gingerbread house or scene to the lowa County Extension Office between Monday, December 1st and Friday, December 12th during office hours (8:00 AM 4:30 PM). Please contact Dan before bringing in your entry so he is aware. ·Each participant or team may submit one entry.
- ·Entries must fit on a board no larger than 12 inches by 12 inches.
  - ·All decorations must be edible.
  - ·All construction and decorating must be completed prior to submission.
- ·All entries become the responsibility of the participant until the end of the contest. The Extension Office is not responsible for damage or loss.
- ·All entries will be disposed of at the office unless arrangements are made to pick them up before Friday, December 19th at 4:30 PM.

# GROWING YOU, GROWING YOUTH

# Experiential Learning And Youth Officers

You've probably heard at least one person associated with 4-H mention, "learn by doing!" This phrase is connected to a research model called the Experiential Learning Model, developed by David Kolb in 1984? It has the following 5 steps:

- 1. Youth **experience** the activity perform or do it.
- 2. Youth **share** the experience and their actions by describing what happened to them. In this step the individual is learning there are different interpretations of reality.
- 3. Youth **process** the experience to determine what was most important and identify common themes and experiences.
- 4. Youth **generalize** from the experience and connect the discussion and experience to the larger world. Asking the question, *So what?*
- 5. Youth **apply** what is learned to a new situation and other parts of life. Asking the question, *Now what?*

When we think about youth officers, the Experiential Learning Model gives us a perfect framework for their leadership development. Officers don't just hold titles —

they have the chance to experience leadership by planning agendas, sharing their ideas with peers, processing what works and what doesn't in meetings, generalizing those lessons to other parts of life, and applying them in new roles and responsibilities. As volunteers, you play a key role in opening the door for these experiences. Involving youth officers may take more time up front, but it pays off in stronger meetings, more confident youth, and less pressure on you to carry the whole load. Think of it as an investment: when youth are engaged in decision-making, they learn responsibility, communication, and problem-solving skills that last far beyond 4-H. Here are a few practical ways to start:

- Invite officers to co-create the agenda with you.
- Encourage them to reflect after meetings: What went well? What could improve?
- Celebrate their growth remind them that leadership is learned by doing, not by being perfect.

By applying the Experiential Learning Model to youth officer roles, you're not only strengthening your club's operations, you're empowering the next generation of leaders.

# Popcorn Balls

#### Ingredients:



7 quarts (approx. 12 cups) popped popcorn



1 cup sugar



1 cup light corn syrup



1 tsp salt



1 tsp vanilla



Liquid food color drops (optional)



4 tablespoons of softened butter



#### Preparation

- Place popped popcorn in a large bowl with room for mixing.
- In a heavy saucepan, combine sugar, corn syrup and salt.
- Cook over medium heat until a candy thermometer reads 235 degrees (soft-ball stage)
- Remove from heat and add food color (optional) and vanilla.
- Immediately pour in a thin stream over popcorn, stirring constantly until evenly coated.
- · Rub thin layer of butter onto clean hands.

- When mixture is cool enough to handle but still warm, work quickly to shape handfuls of coated popporn into a ball shape the size of an adult fist.
- Cool completely and wrap individually in plastic wrap.

Makes 12 to 15 balls.

Optional decorations: Wrap each popcorn ball in clear plastic wrap and decorate outside with cutout construction paper shapes. Easy and fun designs: jack-o-lantern faces, snowman, bunny, baby chick, holiday ornaments, clowns.
